

# Everlast<sup>®</sup> Floor Cleaning Guidelines

Good housekeeping practices will prolong the service life of the floor.

Failure to follow these guidelines will result in the floor continually looking more and more soiled and discolored, as well as may result in deterioration of the floor.

**Clean the floor last** after cleaning the equipment and fixtures, because you want to be sure to also rinse away any disinfectant, caustic dishwasher detergents, and other cleaning chemicals from off the floor.

**Sweep or vacuum** any loose dirt or debris from the surface.

**Cover your floor with a dilution** of Everlast<sup>®</sup> Floor Care Cleaner Concentrate (or Safe Care SC 1000 Concentrate). Use at least a 5% dilution (6.4 ounces of the concentrate mixed with water makes a gallon of properly diluted cleaner). Wait for 10 minutes to let the cleaner break up the grease and grime.

**Agitate the entire cove base** with a deck brush.

**Agitate the floor** with a deck brush or a floor scrubber cleaning machine.

**Extract or push** the soil and excess cleaner into the drains.

**Rinse the floor with clean water** to remove any excess floor cleaner (or other cleaners) and extract or push it into the drains.



A mop is nice to have around to quickly pick up an unplanned mess but...

**Mopping is NOT the most hygienic method of cleaning:** As soon as a mop touches a floor and is rinsed in the bucket the water becomes contaminated, and the now dirty water is used to clean the floor. Since the dirty mop is dipped in the dirty water repeatedly the mop is not actually clean and the contaminants on the mop and in the water are transferred back to the floor and pushed around.



**Mopping is cross-contamination** by ensuring that the soils, oils, corrosive chemicals, germs, bacteria, and viruses are spread throughout the facility.

## ALWAYS RINSE after cleaning

**Corrosive Facility Maintenance Chemicals** such as Dishwasher Detergent, Bathroom Disinfectants, Toilet Bowl Cleaners, Fryer and Hood Cleaners, Bleach, etc. will build up and remain on the floor if not cleaned off and rinsed off nightly. Mopping does not remove these chemicals; it only agitates them.

## Do Not Steam Clean

**Steam is made from boiling water:** Epoxy floors can withstand temperatures up to 158° F, so be mindful of the temperature of the water used for cleaning - as well be careful to keep hot oil and grease off the floor.

**\*Recommended:** Maximum 1800 PSI pressure washer with 45° fan tip. Fine Tip attachments may etch the surface.

**\*\*Avoid:** Hard Bristle Brushes. Use a soft bristle brush, repetitive use of hard bristle brushes may damage your floor's finish, making it harder to maintain.

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
